Board of Trustees

Charged with complete governance of the affairs of the College not reserved to the Corporation, the Board of Trustees establishes major institutional goals, engages in long-range planning and policy-making, oversees the annual operating budget of the College and oversees the review process and recommends a Dominican Friar for election to the Presidency of the College.

The Board of Trustees is comprised of not less than 25 and not more than 35 members. Each member of the Corporation and the Executive Vice President of the College shall be ex officio members of the Board. The remaining members shall be elected by the Corporation from among a list of candidates proposed by the Board of Trustees. A Board member is elected to a three-year term and is eligible to serve three full consecutive terms.

Currently, there are 35 members serving on the Trustees. The members of the College Corporation are also members of the Board of Trustees. The Board meets three times a year. 






Distribution of SAT Scores of First-time, Full-time Cohort: Fall 2014






Distribution of SAT Scores of First-time, Full-time Cohort: Fall 2014






SAT Scores Comparisons by Gender: 5-Year Trends First-time, Full-time Cohorts 2010-2014 (Class of 2014-2018)




SAT Scores Comparisons by Gender: 5-Year Trends First-time, Full-time Cohorts 2010-2014 (Class of 2014-2018)




SAT Comparisons of PC/RI/US: 5-Year Trends First-time, Full-time Cohorts 2010-2014 (Class of 2014-2018)








Undergraduate Day School Admissions: 5-Year Trends First-time, Full-time Cohorts 2010-2014 (Class of 2014-2018)













School of Continuing Education, First-time, Part-time & New Transfer Students Fall 2014



Student Headcount Undergraduate Day School Fall Semesters 2010-2014







Student Headcount School of Continuing Education Fall Semesters 2010-2014



Student Headcount Graduate Studies Fall Semesters 2010-2014





2010-2014 Gender Enrollment Trends







Credit Loads of Undergraduate Day School Students (Average Credit Load = 15.3) (N=3,843)


Credit Loads of School of Continuing Education Students (Average Credit Load = 6.1) (N=333)



































Core Expenses per FTE Enrollment, by Function






